## Pastur's corner

## Rest in the Lord

o you ever have insomnia? Do you ever have nights where you toss and turn in bed, and you are unable to fall asleep? You are so full of worries and anxieties that your mind just won't turn off, your body can't rest, and your heart is unable to find peace. The patriarch, Jacob, had a night like this. Jacob was returning home after years away. He had fled from Esau's wrath because he had tricked his father and stolen from his brother. Jacob had been blessed with wives and children and flocks and herds while he was away, but now he was coming home. Now, he would have to face his brother. Full of fear and anxiety on the night before his face-to-face confrontation with Esau, Jacob left his party because he wanted to spend the entire night alone. I'm sure he expected a night of insomnia, of tossing and turning, of laying down wide-awake, unable to sleep.

But Jacob was not alone. God was with him. And yet, God was not exactly there to comfort him. Genesis 32 describes Jacob's night as an intense wrestling match. That night, Jacob wrestled with an opponent who was strong and untiring. Who knows if this man would overtake Jacob? Who knows if this man wanted to kill Jacob? Eventually, Jacob realized that this Man was God Himself. He demands that the Lord bless him,

and so God said, "Your name shall no longer be called Jacob, but Israel, for you have striven with God and with men, and have prevailed." The next morning, Israel limped off to meet his brother.

Perhaps you can identify with the patriarch, Jacob. Perhaps, in your tossing and turning at night, in your fears and apprehensions, your worry and your anxiety, perhaps you are wrestling with God. Perhaps you are asking God questions like, "Why did this or that happen to me?" or "Why is my loved one afflicted with such a terrible illness or with this or that situation that is beyond their control?" Sometimes this wrestling match lasts for a few hours. Sometimes, it afflicts us all night long. God often chooses this night time to wrestle with you because during the day your eyes and your mind are busy, and you are distracted

from God by the things of the world. At night, God can get your full attention more easily. Furthermore, if it is God who is the one who afflicts you, it is because He loves you. It is because He desires to discipline you and to

strengthen you, to test you and to give you faith. In these situations, give thanks to God for His love for you. Give thanks for sending His Son to die for you. Give thanks for His claiming you in Holy Baptism. Pray to Him about what troubles you, and leave yourself in His keeping.

However, it is possible that the devil may also want to afflict you at night. His desire is to cause despair. He revels in your anxiety, and will use it to lead you away from your fear, love, and trust in God. In those situations, if your sleepless nights are leading you to despair, sit up. Go to your kitchen table or your living room.

Make the sign of the cross, and say, "May God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit watch over me this night." Then, confess the Apostles' Creed, pray the Lord's Prayer, read your Bible, and pray about your fears and anxieties until you are tired. If the devil is going to keep you awake, then do something that he hates. Do something that is beneficial to your faith. Remember that you are a baptized child of God, and cling to the cross of Jesus Christ for your forgiveness and salvation. For, it is in these blessings that God strengthens you, comforts you in the most difficult times and situations, and gives you the victory even in your darkest hours. God bless and keep you all!
