Church Council Report From the meeting of August 21, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 7:32 p.m. by President Adam Ondrajka. Present were: Adam Ondrajka, Pastor Kern, Caleb Storm, Chris Durham, Randy Haas, Tim Forys, Karen Forys, Kathy Tallieu, Marty Brandt, and Renea Lambert.

Pastor opened the meeting with a devotion from the book, "Day By Day We Magnify Thee", based upon the writings of Martin Luther.

The <u>Treasurer's Report</u> was distributed and reviewed. It showed that total Income for the month of July was \$20,655.59 with Expenses of \$16,170.95 for that same period. A motion to accept the Report was made by Tim Forys and seconded by Chris Durham. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report

Update since the last meeting:

- There were no Baptisms, Weddings, Confirmations, or Funerals
- 19 Worship Services held (includes those at Peace Lutheran)
- Bible Study on Lutheran Distinctives continues
- Pastor made 7 Home/Institutional Visits
- Attended Higher Things with the Youth Group
- One person is in Adult Instruction
- Two couples in Pre-Marital Counseling (one couple from Peace)
- Weekly Confirmation Classes at OSL begin on Wednesday, September 10th, starting at 6:00 p.m.
- Youth Nights begin on Friday, September 26th. This will be an every-othermonth event, running from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m.
- There will be a Tri-Parish Cemetery Clean Up at the Argyle Cemetery on Saturday, October 4th at 9:00 a.m. The congregations of Our Savior, Peace, and Good Shepherd-Cass City will participate. Rain Date: Saturday, October 11th.
- Pastor has been asked by Rev. Michael Eschelbach (former Peace Pastor) to participate in a "Best Practices" Conference in Phoenix, Arizona. This Conference will be held in February and Homeschool Co-Ops are one of the topics. There will be an announcement in the Sunday Bulletin about this, along with a request to consider making a donation to help him cover travel expenses, etc.

Old Business

 Council members who are also on the Constitution Revision Committee were asked to stay following the Council meeting for a very brief meeting.

New Business

- A request has been made to assign a designated 2-6 Grade Sunday School classroom in the school. It was decided that the former 5/6 grade classroom (between the Restrooms and Library) will be their classroom.
- A request has also been made to assign a designated Youth Room in the school building. It was decided that the classroom that formerly housed 2nd/3rd grades (the classroom just past the Homeschool Co-Op room) will be their assigned room. Arrangements will be made with school staff to finish clearing out materials currently left there.
- Pastor will be getting more information from "Positive Alternatives", a
 pregnancy counseling service in Tuscola County, on the possibility of offering a space in the school to house a Baby Pantry. Volunteers from OSL
 would be needed to help run the Pantry. Pastor will bring an update to
 the next meeting. A decision on whether to go forward with the plan was
 tabled until more information is gathered.
- Renea Lambert and Kathy Rachow have asked permission to refresh and paint the kitchen island. Trustees attending the meeting gave their approval.

The Secretary's Report from this meeting was read to the group. A motion to accept was made by Karen Forys and seconded by Tim Forys. Motion carried.

A motion to adjourn was made by Karen Forys and seconded by Kathy Tallieu. Motion carried. The meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer at 8:12 p.m.
